(put pumps in the trash)



Plastic food and beverage tubs, jugs and bottles  
(keep lids and caps screwed on)



Plastic bathroom bottles  
(put pumps in the trash)



Glass food jars  
(put lids and caps in the trash)



Glass beverage bottles  
(put lids and caps in the trash)



Aluminum, tin, steel cans and empty aerosol bottles



Mixed paper, office paper, glossy paper, envelopes and Post-It notes



Flattened cardboard



Newspapers, magazines, phonebooks and catalogs



Food boxes, paper boxes, paper towel rolls, paper egg cartons and paper bags



Beverage cartons

## NOT ACCEPTED



- Plastic bags\*
- Styrofoam
- Household trash
- Medical waste
- Scrap metal or wires\*\*
- No tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, etc.)

- Food waste\*\*
- Broken glass
- Window or mirror glass
- Dishes or cookware
- Aluminum foil or trays
- Light bulbs
- Clothing or fabric\*\*

- Hardcover books
- Yard waste
- Shredded paper
- Hazardous waste\*\*
- Liquid waste (paint, cleaners, etc.)



\* Take clean and dry plastic bags and film back to the grocery store to recycle separately and/or take to a public or private drop-off recycling center.

\*\* These materials can be taken to a public or private drop-off recycling center to be recycled separately. Contact your local agency for possible alternative recycling options.
