Do I Need A Permit?

Check Your Mailbox

Inspect your mailboxes so they are able to withstand the weight of snow and snow being plowed onto them. Boxes must be far enough off the street so they are not in the path of the snow plow. Green Level will accept responsibility for a mailbox that is hit by a snow plow, but will not be responsibly for a mailbox that was unable to withstand the weight of snow being plowed onto the box.

Raw sewage can come through toilets, sinks, showers and washing machines. Clogs in underground pipes that wastewater runs through, can be triggered by fats, oils, and grease. These substances congeal, blocking pipes and catching other debris that don't break down.

Alamance, Cone Health, and Alamance Citizens for a Drug-Free Community, the Burlington Police Department is now home to a permanent, secure drop-box for medication disposal. Not only is disposing of unused medications safer for our water supply, but it will be kept out of the hands of potential abusers and away from children. Sadly, each year, 56 children under the age of 14 die from unintentional medication overdoses. Visit the Burlington Police Department at 267 W. Front St. during regular business hours to safely dispose of your medications in the new drop-box located in the main lobby.

Help Prevent Sewer Backup

Most backups on the sanitary sewer system occur between the home and sewer lines. The following can help prevent costly unsanitary backups.

Do: Dispose of excess grease or cooking oil in the garbage, not down the drain. As grease cools, it can cause blockage in the lines.

Do: Dispose of food scrapes in the garbage.

Do: Place a wastebasket in the bathroom to dispose of waste products such as diapers, baby wipes, and feminine hygiene products. Toilet paper is specifically designed to deteriorate.

Do: Repair or contact a plumber for leakage.

Do not: Pour grease or cooking oil down the drain.

Do not: Use the toilet as a wastebasket.
