

During Black History Month, we celebrate the legacy of Americans whose power to lead, to overcome, and to expand the meaning and practice of American democracy has been indispensable to helping our counties, states, and the nation become a more a fair and just society. This country was established upon the profound but simple ideas that all people are created equal, and a free people should govern themselves through a representative democracy. Nowhere are those ideals more prevalent than in the Town of Green Level.

The community known as Ruby Do was born out of segregation where Blacks were allowed to purchase land. The people of that community were so self-sufficient that they started their own business and built a school in the 1930's to educate their children. That school is still in use serving once as the Town Hall and now as The Green Level Community Center.

The founders and residents of Ruby Do aka Green Level, who were largely Black Americans, organized the community into a town whereby they could govern themselves. The Town of Green Level was incorporated in 1990 the basic needs and rights of the residents because not being adequately addressed at the were county level. The struggles and challenges of the Black American story to make a way out of no way has been the crucible where resolve to fulfill this vision has often been tested. Struggles for freedom, equal treatment, equal opportunities in education, housing, and the workplace, for economic opportunity, equal justice, and political representation was the intent of the founders and continues to be the goal of the current town council and staff. Green Level residents and leaders have made a way not only for themselves but have also helped build a municipality dedicated to fostering an environment where all

Americans can more fully experience the benefits of a just society.
